



# Practice Briefs

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## **I am in charge of Infection Control (IC) in a long term care facility. I've heard about IC Risk Assessments. Is an Infection Control Risk Assessment necessary?**

Yes, a formal risk assessment for healthcare acquired infections (HAI) should be implemented. This is now required according to the Medicare and Medicaid Programs; Reform of Requirements for Long-Term Care Facilities (2016)<sup>1</sup>. The proposed language specifically cites “requirement for the facility to perform a facility – specific assessment of their resident population and facility in regard to addressing HAI.”
