

<p>COVID-19 Patient Screening Tool: This screening tool incorporates the most current dental and vaccine guidance that is available from the CDC as of 2/19/2021. Clinical decisions on COVID-19 status and treatment must be made by clinical staff within their scope of practice.</p>		
Screening Questions	Yes/ No	Notes
<p>Fever or Chills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If a patient has a fever that is strongly associated with a dental condition and presents with no other symptoms consistent with COVID-19, dental treatment can be provided following IPC Practices for Dental Care Fever is a common symptom of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine, even if no other symptoms consistent with COVID-19 may be present, any febrile patient should be rescheduled for treatment 		Active Temperature Screening:
<p>Cough</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Cough is not a common symptom of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. Patients should be rescheduled and recommended to see their primary care provider for possible COVID-19 testing. 		
<p>Shortness of Breath or Difficulty Breathing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Shortness of breath/ difficulty breathing are not common symptoms of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. Patients should be rescheduled and recommended to see their primary care provider for possible COVID-19 testing. 		
<p>Fatigue</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fatigue is a common symptom of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine, if a patient presents with this symptom within 48 hours of receiving the vaccine and is afebrile without respiratory or GI symptoms, they may receive dental treatment 		
<p>Muscle or Body Aches (Myalgia)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Muscle/ body aches are common symptoms of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine, if a patient presents with these symptoms within 48 hours of receiving the vaccine and are afebrile without respiratory or GI symptoms, they may receive dental treatment 		
<p>Headache</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Headache is a common symptom of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine, if a patient presents with this symptom within 48 hours of receiving the vaccine and is afebrile without respiratory or GI symptoms, they may receive dental treatment 		

<p>New Loss of Taste or Smell</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Loss of taste or smell is not a common symptom of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. Patients should be rescheduled and recommended to see their primary care provider for possible COVID-19 testing. 		
<p>Sore Throat</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sore Throat is not a common symptom of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. Patients should be rescheduled and recommended to see their primary care provider for possible COVID-19 testing. 		
<p>Congestion or Runny Nose</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Congestion/ runny nose are not common symptoms of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. Patients should be rescheduled and recommended to see their primary care provider for possible COVID-19 testing. 		
<p>Nausea or Vomiting</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nausea/ vomiting are not common symptoms of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. Patients should be rescheduled and recommended to see their primary care provider for possible COVID-19 testing. 		
<p>Diarrhea</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Diarrhea is not a common symptom of receiving the COVID-19 vaccine. Patients should be rescheduled and recommended to see their primary care provider for possible COVID-19 testing. 		
<p>Tested positive for COVID-19 or presented with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 in the last 14 days</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Patients that meet the Discontinuation of Isolation guidelines provided by the CDC can be treated in the dental office following CDC guidance on IPC Practices for Dental Care. 		
<p>Exposed to anyone that has tested positive or has been told to quarantine in the last 14 days</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fully vaccinated individuals (>2 weeks following final dose) who are within 3 months of receiving the last vaccine dose and have remained asymptomatic since the COVID-19 exposure are not required to quarantine.
