

Summary:

The ICAP team wanted to bust the myth that disease outbreaks never happen in dentistry because there aren't many reported cases.

Key Takeaways:

- Even though outbreaks are not commonly reported, there is still a large risk of transmission in the dental setting.
- Hepatitis B vaccinations are a great way to reduce risk.
- Engineer infection control to be easy for staff: easy access to PPE/ supplies, assigning duties so they don't get forgotten
- Work as a team to protect each other and your patients
- Very large risk for percutaneous exposure based on the types of procedures that are done in dentistry
- Dental Unit Waterlines and Air/ Water Syringe tips have the potential to have biofilm that can be a cause of outbreaks
- Handpieces and suctions are prone to backflow and should be cleaned/ sterilized/ used properly and according to manufacturer's instructions for use
- Use available tools to make sure your practice is following all recommended practices for safe care.
